# E. Suggested Activities

# a. Featured

## **Multiple Choice**

- Grammar check: "Which sentence is correct?"
- Vocabulary test: "Choose the synonym for 'happy'."
- Reading comprehension: questions after a short passage.

### Poll

- "Which English skill do you find hardest: Speaking, Listening, Reading, Writing?"
- Opinion poll: "Do you prefer learning English with games or videos?"
- Warm-up: "What do you usually do before an exam?"

# **Word Cloud**

- Brainstorm topic vocabulary: "Write words related to 'Travel'."
- Predictions: "What do you think this story will be about?"
- Reflection: "One word that describes your learning today."

## b. Assess Understanding

## **Open Question**

- Short writing: "Describe your last holiday in 2–3 sentences."
- Summarize a text: "What is the main idea of this paragraph?"
- Speaking prep: Students type ideas before oral presentation.

### Label an Image

- Label parts of the body / house / city map.
- Identify grammar structures in a sentence picture.
- Mark locations on a world map (countries speaking English).

#### **Drag and Drop**

- Sentence building: drag words to form correct sentence.
- Match pictures with vocabulary words.
- Order story events after reading a passage.

## Find on Image

- Highlight prepositions: "Click on the object under the table."
- Point out cultural elements in a picture.
- Identify mistakes in a written text.

# Matching

- Match words with definitions.
- Match guestions with answers.
- Match idioms with their meanings.

#### Fill in the Blanks

- Grammar gaps: "She \_\_\_\_ (go) to school yesterday."
- Vocabulary in context: "The hotel room was very \_\_\_\_ (comfortable/comfortably)."
- Listening gap-fill with short audio.

### Find a Number

- Listening: "How much does the ticket cost?"
- Reading: "What year did the author publish this book?"
- Math in English: simple problem-solving.

## Sorting

- Sort adjectives into positive/negative.
- Sort tenses into past/present/future.
- Sort vocabulary into categories (food, transport, clothes).

# Script Concordance Test (SCT) / Judgment

- "If a student says 'He go to school yesterday,' is it correct?" (Yes/No)
- Judging sentence tone: formal vs informal.
- Decide if a statement is fact or opinion.
- c. Gather Feedback

#### Framework

- Students rank importance: Grammar, Vocabulary, Fluency.
- Evaluate lesson clarity (content, speed, interaction).
- Rate comfort with skills (listening, writing, etc.).

### Rating

- Rate their confidence: "How confident are you using conditionals?"
- Rate a peer's presentation.
- Rate usefulness of a lesson.

### **Prioritization**

- "Which skill should we focus on next: pronunciation, writing, or listening?"
- "Which vocabulary group do you want to learn first: food, travel, work?"
- "Order these tips for good writing from most to least important."

### **Brainstorming**

- Generate ideas for a group project (poster, debate, story).
- Collect topic sentences for an essay.
- Share strategies for learning vocabulary.
- d. Showcase Information

### Audio/Video

- Play a song clip: identify missing words.
- Play a video and ask comprehension questions.
- Show pronunciation differences with audio.

### Slide

- Present vocabulary lists with pictures.
- Show step-by-step grammar explanations.
- Provide models for essay writing.

## Timer

- 1-minute vocabulary brainstorming challenge.
- Timed speaking practice: "Talk about your weekend for 2 minutes."
- Countdown for group discussions.

## Spin the Wheel

- Randomly choose a student to answer.
- Vocabulary revision: spin to get a category.
- Grammar challenge: spin to get tense to use.
